A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING METHODS TO PROMOTE TRANSPARENCY IN CONNECTION**
102 **WITH PUBLIC DISCLOSURE BY LOBBYISTS.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries>.)

The bill makes the following modifications to existing statutory provisions governing lobbying:

- ! Adds a definition of "client" that replaces the term "principal" in the existing statute;

Shading denotes HOUSE amendment. Double underlining denotes SENATE amendment.
Capital letters indicate new material to be added to existing statute.
Dashes through the words indicate deletions from existing statute.

- ! In the case of a single-member lobbying firm, if a monthly disclosure statement filed by a lobbyist with the secretary of state includes the name of the professional lobbyist and the name of a lobbying firm that solely employs the lobbyist, specifies that a single disclosure statement may be filed with the secretary on behalf of both the professional lobbyist and the lobbying firm;
- ! If a professional lobbyist receives business from another professional lobbyist on a subcontract basis, requires the lobbyist receiving such business to describe in an annual disclosure statement the total gross income received from the professional lobbyist under the subcontract who is contemporaneously reporting the subcontracting business on his or her annual disclosure statement;
- ! Requires a lobbyist to update his or her registration within 24 hours if he or she agrees to lobby for a client or other lobbyist on a subcontract basis who is not disclosed in the lobbyist's original registration statement;
- ! Clarifies that an attorney who is a lobbyist is required to disclose information about the clients for whom he or she lobbies in accordance with existing disclosure requirements to the same extent as a lobbyist who is not an attorney;
- ! Requires a professional lobbyist's registration statement to include information about any other professional lobbyist for whom he or she is lobbying on a subcontract basis; and
- ! Expands the information available on the existing web site maintained by the secretary of state to allow the public to cross-reference and review information, in a form such as hyperlinks, concerning the client of a professional lobbyist or the bill number of legislation on which he or she is lobbying that is contained in a registration or disclosure statement filed by a professional lobbyist.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-6-301, **amend** (1),
3 (1.9) (a) (I), (1.9) (a) (X), (1.9) (a) (XI), (2.5), and (6); **repeal** (5.5); and
4 **add** (1.3) and (3.6) as follows:

5 **24-6-301. Definitions - legislative declaration.** As used in this
6 part 3, unless the context otherwise requires:

7 (1) "~~Communication~~" ~~includes but is not limited to a transmittal~~

1 ~~of information, data, ideas, opinions, or anything of a similar nature,~~
2 ~~either oral, written, or by any other means, to a covered official "CLIENT"~~
3 MEANS ANY PERSON WHO EMPLOYS, COMPENSATES, OR OTHERWISE
4 ENGAGES THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES OF A LOBBYIST. FOR THE PURPOSES
5 OF THIS PART 3, A PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST IS NOT A CLIENT OF ANOTHER
6 LOBBYIST FOR WHOM HE OR SHE UNDERTAKES LOBBYING ON A
7 SUBCONTRACT BASIS NOR IS THE PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST A CLIENT OF A
8 LOBBYING FIRM.

9 (1.3) "COMMUNICATION" INCLUDES BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO A
10 TRANSMITTAL OF INFORMATION, DATA, IDEAS, OPINIONS, OR ANYTHING OF
11 A SIMILAR NATURE, EITHER ORAL, WRITTEN, OR BY ANY OTHER MEANS, TO
12 A COVERED OFFICIAL.

13 (1.9) (a) "Disclosure statement" means a written statement that
14 contains:

15 (I) The name and address of each ~~person~~ CLIENT OR OTHER
16 PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST who has made a contribution totaling one
17 hundred dollars or more ~~to or for the disclosing person for lobbying~~
18 ~~during the fiscal year, together with the amount thereof~~ LOBBYING AND
19 THE AMOUNT PAID SINCE THE PREVIOUS DISCLOSURE REPORT;

20 (X) The nature of the legislation, standards, rules, or rates for
21 which the disclosing person is ~~receiving contributions or making~~
22 ~~expenditures for~~ lobbying and, where known, the specific legislation,
23 standards, rules, or rates. In the case of specific legislation, ~~disclosure~~
24 ~~shall include, during a regular or special session of the general assembly,~~
25 THE PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST SHALL INCLUDE the bill number of the
26 legislation, and whether ~~the disclosing person's principal~~ SUCH LOBBYIST'S
27 CLIENT is supporting, opposing, amending, or monitoring the legislation

1 ~~identified as of~~ AT the time a ~~OF THE~~ disclosure statement. ~~is required to~~
2 ~~be filed pursuant to section 24-6-302 (3), after the disclosing person is~~
3 ~~retained to advocate or monitor in connection with the legislation.~~ The
4 ~~disclosure statement~~ PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST shall specify that the
5 ~~disclosing person's~~ HIS OR HER representation is accurate as of the date of
6 disclosure only and that ~~such~~ THE representation is not binding ~~on the~~
7 ~~disclosing person after such date~~ and is subject to change ~~subsequent to~~
8 ~~such~~ AFTER THE date and ~~prior to~~ BEFORE the time the next disclosure
9 statement is due. If a ~~disclosure statement from a disclosing person during~~
10 ~~a regular or special session of the general assembly~~ PROFESSIONAL
11 LOBBYIST fails to show any bill numbers or nature of the legislation, as
12 applicable, the ~~disclosing person shall be required to make an affirmative~~
13 ~~statement~~ SUCH LOBBYIST SHALL AFFIRM that he or she was not retained
14 in connection with any legislation. Nothing in this subparagraph (X) ~~shall~~
15 ~~require~~ REQUIRES any additional disclosure on the part of a ~~disclosing~~
16 ~~person~~ LOBBYIST before the next applicable reporting deadline pursuant
17 to section 24-6-302 (3). For purposes of this subparagraph (X),
18 "legislation" means the process of making or enacting law in written form
19 in the form of codes, statutes, or rules. NOTHING IN THIS SUBPARAGRAPH
20 (X) REQUIRES A LOBBYIST TO AMEND A PREVIOUSLY FILED DISCLOSURE
21 STATEMENT UPON LEARNING THE BILL NUMBER OF A PREVIOUSLY
22 DISCLOSED PIECE OF LEGISLATION.

23 (XI) If the ~~disclosing person's principal~~ CLIENT OR OTHER
24 PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST is an individual, the name and address of the
25 individual and a description of the business activity in which the
26 individual is engaged. If the ~~disclosing person's principal~~ CLIENT OR
27 OTHER PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST is a business entity, a description of the

1 business entity in which the ~~principal~~ CLIENT OR OTHER LOBBYIST is
2 engaged and the name or names of the entity's chief executive officer, ~~or~~
3 partners, OR OTHER DESIGNATED CONTACT PERSON, as applicable. If the
4 ~~disclosing person's principal~~ CLIENT OR OTHER LOBBYIST is an industry,
5 trade, organization or group of persons, or professional association, a
6 description of the industry, trade, organization or group of persons, or
7 profession that the ~~disclosing person~~ LOBBYIST represents.

8 (2.5) "Gross income for lobbying" means the total ~~income~~
9 AMOUNT RECEIVED FROM A CLIENT, including compensation for services,
10 fees, and similar payments, before any deductions are made, ~~received by~~
11 a professional lobbyist for lobbying or by a LOBBYING firm. ~~organized for~~
12 ~~professional lobbying purposes that employs a professional lobbyist.~~

13 (3.6) "LOBBYING FIRM" MEANS A PERSON OR ENTITY EMPLOYING
14 ONE OR MORE PROFESSIONAL LOBBYISTS TO LOBBY ON BEHALF OF A
15 CLIENT THAT IS NOT THE PERSON OR ENTITY. "LOBBYING FIRM" INCLUDES
16 A SELF-EMPLOYED PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST.

17 (5.5) ~~"Principal" means any person who employs a lobbyist. If an~~
18 ~~association, corporation, limited liability company, partnership, or any~~
19 ~~other organization or group of persons or form of business entity engages~~
20 ~~a lobbyist, a person serving as an officer, employee, member, shareholder,~~
21 ~~or partner of the association, corporation, limited liability company,~~
22 ~~partnership, or other organization or group of persons or form of business~~
23 ~~entity shall not be considered a principal.~~

24 (6) "Professional lobbyist" means ~~any individual who engages~~
25 ~~himself or is engaged by any other person for pay or for any consideration~~
26 ~~for lobbying~~ A PERSON, BUSINESS ENTITY, INCLUDING A SOLE
27 PROPRIETORSHIP, OR AN EMPLOYEE OF A CLIENT, WHO IS COMPENSATED BY

1 A CLIENT OR ANOTHER PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST FOR LOBBYING.
2 "Professional lobbyist" does not include any volunteer lobbyist, any state
3 official or employee acting in his official capacity, except as provided in
4 section 24-6-303.5, any elected public official acting in his official
5 capacity, or any individual who appears as counsel or advisor in an
6 adjudicatory proceeding.

7 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-6-302, **amend**
8 (2.5) (a), (3), (4), and (6) (b); and **add** (8) as follows:

9 **24-6-302. Disclosure statements - required.** (2.5) (a) A
10 professional lobbyist and any LOBBYING firm ~~organized for professional~~
11 ~~lobbying purposes that employs such lobbyist~~ shall file A MONTHLY
12 ~~disclosure statements in accordance with this section~~ Such a disclosure
13 ~~statement, in lieu of the contributions described in section 24-6-301 (1.9)~~
14 ~~(a) (I), (1.9) (a) (II), and (1.9) (a) (III), shall contain the gross income for~~
15 ~~lobbying since the prior month's disclosure statement and the name and~~
16 ~~address of any person from whom gross income for lobbying is received~~
17 ~~totaling one hundred dollars or more~~ STATEMENT WITH THE SECRETARY
18 OF STATE NO LATER THAN THE FIFTEENTH DAY AFTER THE END OF THE
19 FIRST CALENDAR MONTH, AND EACH SUBSEQUENT MONTH, IN WHICH THE
20 LOBBYIST RECEIVED ANY INCOME OR MADE ANY EXPENDITURES FOR
21 LOBBYING. IN THE CASE OF A SINGLE-MEMBER LOBBYING FIRM, IF A
22 DISCLOSURE STATEMENT INCLUDES THE NAME OF THE PROFESSIONAL
23 LOBBYIST AND THE NAME OF A LOBBYING FIRM THAT SOLELY EMPLOYS
24 THE LOBBYIST, A SINGLE DISCLOSURE STATEMENT MAY BE FILED WITH THE
25 SECRETARY OF STATE ON BEHALF OF BOTH THE PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST
26 AND THE LOBBYING FIRM.

27 (3) (a) ~~A disclosure statement shall be filed within fifteen days~~

1 after the end of the first calendar month in which any contribution or
2 gross income for lobbying is received or any expenditure is made or
3 incurred for lobbying and shall be filed within fifteen days after the end
4 of each subsequent month during the fiscal year.

5 (b) ~~A cumulative~~ IN ADDITION TO THE MONTHLY DISCLOSURE
6 STATEMENT, A PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST SHALL FILE WITH THE SECRETARY
7 OF STATE AN ANNUAL disclosure statement for the entire fiscal year shall
8 be filed by a professional lobbyist or a firm organized for professional
9 lobbying purposes on or before NO LATER THAN July 15 covering THAT
10 COVERS the fiscal year immediately preceding the date on which the
11 cumulative disclosure statement is due. Such FISCAL YEAR. THE ANNUAL
12 disclosure statement shall MUST contain the name of and total gross
13 income for lobbying received from each person for AND THE AMOUNT
14 RECEIVED FROM EACH CLIENT OR OTHER PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST FOR
15 WHOM THE LOBBYIST LOBBIED DURING the previous fiscal year. If a firm
16 organized for professional lobbying purposes subcontracts lobbying
17 business to another such firm or professional lobbyist, or if a professional
18 lobbyist subcontracts lobbying business to another such firm or lobbyist,
19 only the firm or professional lobbyist that receives the business on a
20 subcontract shall report the information required to be disclosed pursuant
21 to this subsection (3). The firm or professional lobbyist that subcontracted
22 the business to another firm or professional lobbyist IF A PROFESSIONAL
23 LOBBYIST RECEIVES BUSINESS FROM ANOTHER PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST
24 ON A SUBCONTRACT BASIS, THE LOBBYIST RECEIVING SUCH BUSINESS shall
25 describe in an addendum or a supplement to the report required to be filed
26 pursuant to the provisions of this subsection (3) AN ANNUAL DISCLOSURE
27 STATEMENT the total gross income received from lobbying that is being

16 (6) (b) A professional lobbyist who provides the notification under
17 paragraph (a) of this subsection (6) shall file, concurrently with the next
18 disclosure statement due after such notification, a signed written
19 statement that contains:

20 (I) The name and address of the person described in such
21 notification; AND

22 (II) A summary of the terms related to lobbying under the
23 agreement between such person and the professional lobbyist. A
24 PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST SHALL ALSO UPDATE HIS OR HER REGISTRATION
25 WITHIN TWENTY-FOUR HOURS IF HE OR SHE AGREES TO LOBBY FOR A
26 CLIENT OR OTHER LOBBYIST ON A SUBCONTRACT BASIS WHO IS NOT
27 DISCLOSED IN THE LOBBYIST'S ORIGINAL REGISTRATION STATEMENT.

3 (8) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS PART 3, AN

5 INFORMATION ABOUT THE CLIENTS FOR WHOM HE OR SHE LOBBIES IN
6 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS PART 3 TO THE SAME EXTENT AS A PROFESSIONAL
7 LOBBYIST WHO IS NOT AN ATTORNEY.

12 **declaration.** (1) ~~Any professional lobbyist, Before engaging in lobbying,~~
13 A PROFESSIONAL LOBBYIST shall ~~register with the secretary of state and~~
14 ~~file a written or~~ AN electronic registration statement WITH THE SECRETARY
15 OF STATE that ~~shall contain~~ CONTAINS:

16 (a) His or her full legal name, business address, and business
17 telephone number;

18 (b) The name, address, and telephone number of ~~any person by~~
19 ~~whom he or she is employed~~ HIS OR HER EMPLOYER, IF APPLICABLE;

20 (c) The name, address, and telephone number of any ~~person~~ THE
21 CLIENT for whom he or she will be lobbying; and

22 (d) The name, address, and telephone number of any ~~person by~~
23 ~~whom the professional lobbyist or firm organized for professional~~
24 ~~lobbying is paid or is to be paid for such lobbying~~ OTHER PROFESSIONAL
25 LOBBYIST FOR WHOM HE OR SHE IS LOBBYING ON A SUBCONTRACT BASIS.

26 (3) Consistent with the requirements of subsection (6.3) of this
27 section, a hard copy of all registration statements and disclosure

1 statements of professional lobbyists and LOBBYING firms ~~organized for~~
2 ~~lobbying purposes shall~~ MUST be compiled by the secretary of state within
3 thirty days after the end of the calendar month for which such information
4 is filed and shall be organized alphabetically according to the names of
5 the lobbyists and firms.

6 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-6-304, **amend** (2)
7 as follows:

8 **24-6-304. Records - preservation - public inspection -**
9 **electronic access.** (2) (a) ~~THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL PRESERVE any~~
10 ~~statement required by this part 3 to be filed with the secretary of state~~
11 ~~shall be preserved by the secretary of state for a period of five years after~~
12 ~~the date of filing shall constitute~~ AND MAKE THEM part of the public
13 records of that office. ~~and shall be open and readily accessible for public~~
14 ~~inspection.~~ The secretary of state shall implement AND MAINTAIN a
15 computer information system ON THE SECRETARY OF STATE'S OFFICIAL
16 WEB SITE that ~~will allow~~ ALLOWS computer users to cross-reference and
17 review, using the name of a professional lobbyist, ~~or any other person~~

26 electronic read-only access to the information required ~~to be filed~~ by this
27 part 3 free of charge. All information required to be filed by this part 3

1 that is filed electronically shall be made available:

2 (I) On the web site within twenty-four hours after filing; and

3 (II) In a form, SUCH AS HYPERLINKS, that allows ~~a computer user~~

10 **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-6-305, **amend**
11 (1.5) as follows:

12 **24-6-305. Powers of the secretary of state - granting and**
13 **revoking of certificates - barring from registration - imposition of**
14 **penalties - notification of substantial violation.** (1.5) (a) In the case of
15 ~~misconduct by an individual culminating in the~~ revocation of a certificate
16 of registration in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (b) or (e)
17 of subsection (1) of this section, the secretary of state shall additionally
18 indicate the revocation ~~of the individual's certificate of registration~~ on the
19 web site ~~maintained by the secretary~~ and shall send written notice of the
20 revocation by United States mail to each ~~principal~~ CLIENT OR OTHER
21 LOBBYIST for whom the individual lobbies as shown on the individual's
22 registration statement filed pursuant to section 24-6-303 (1).

23 (b) In the case of ~~misconduct by an individual culminating in a~~
24 ~~resolution of~~ censure that has been adopted by the general assembly, ~~in~~
25 ~~accordance with its rules on lobbying practices~~ the secretary of state shall
26 send a copy of the resolution by United States mail to each ~~principal~~
27 CLIENT OR OTHER LOBBYIST for whom the individual lobbies as shown on

1 the individual's registration statement filed pursuant to section 24-6-303
2 (1).

3 **SECTION 6.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-6-308, **amend** (1)
4 (e) as follows:

5 **24-6-308. Prohibited practices.** (1) No person engaged in
6 lobbying shall:

7 (e) Knowingly represent an interest adverse to the lobbyist's
8 ~~principal~~ CLIENT without first obtaining the consent of the ~~principal~~
9 CLIENT after full disclosure by the lobbyist of the adverse interest;

10 **SECTION 7. Effective date.** This act takes effect July 1, 2015.

11 **SECTION 8. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
12 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
13 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
